Position Purpose

The Psychiatry Registrar is accountable to the Medical Director of the Mental Health Division and will work collaboratively with the broader Mental Health staff and teams.

The incumbent is required to perform the duties of this position efficiently to the standards of the department, including participating in the Austin Health performance appraisal program. This will require rotation through a number of aspects of psychiatry.

About Mental Health

Austin Health Mental Health Division provides care and services through a comprehensive range of teams to meet the needs of mental health consumers and carers throughout Victoria.

Services in the Mental Health Division are located across Austin Health and the community. Employees may be redeployed within the Mental Health Division.

All mental health services work within a clinical framework that promotes recovery oriented practice and supported decision making. This approach to client wellbeing builds on the strengths of the individual working in partnership with their treating team. It encompasses the principles of self-determination and individualised treatment and care.

Purpose and Accountabilities

- Assess and treat patients with mental illness, with appropriate level of supervision from the consultant psychiatrist
- Provide clinical leadership and work collaboratively within a multidisciplinary team setting
- Liaise with health care professionals [HCP] across teams and divisions within Austin Health as well as external to the Austin
- Participation in after hours and ECT rosters
- Active participation in the weekly registrar education program and peer support
- Active engagement in teaching and supervision for medical students/Interns/HMOs
