Position Purpose

The objective of this position is to provide an Endoscopy Clinical and Research Fellow role to:

- Further training in Endoscopy, in particular Advanced Endoscopic techniques.
- Provide leave cover for Unit consultants and the Endoscopy Fellow for either outpatients clinics and or Endoscopy sessions.
- Provide support and teaching to Resident and Registrar medical staff through direction and management of patients.
- Support emergency Endoscopy work.
- Perform quality research at Austin Health
- Assess and facilitate the introduction of endoscopic equipment and techniques.
- Clinical and research development of the incumbent is a significant component of the role.
- Provide an alternate pathway to the Endoscopy Fellow position.

About the Department

The Austin Gastroenterology Unit provides expert care in the fields of luminal Gastroenterology, Hepatology, interventional Endoscopy, intestinal failure and hepatocellular carcinoma.

Emergency and inpatient services are based at Austin Hospital while outpatient services and endoscopy are based on the Austin Hospital and Heidelberg Repatriation Hospital. In addition, a consultative service is provided for other Units within the health service. The Unit maintains an ongoing commitment to undergraduate and postgraduate teaching.

There are weekly multidisciplinary outpatient clinics for general Gastroenterology, inflammatory bowel disease, liver disease, viral hepatitis, hepatocellular carcinoma and intestinal failure/rehabilitation.

The Endoscopy service provided by the Gastroenterology Unit is the largest in the state, offering a weekly advanced Endoscopy outpatient clinic for complex referrals, in addition to routine gastroscopy, colonoscopy, endoscopic ultrasound (EUS), ERCP and balloon enteroscopy.

A Gastroenterology physiology laboratory has recently been established to provide upper Gastrointestinal and anorectal manometry, pH studies, capsule endoscopy and Fibroscan.

Purpose and Accountabilities

Role Specific:

Clinical Care:

- To provide comprehensive gastrointestinal care to inpatients and outpatients
- To participate in Unit meetings and activities.
- To participate in the registrar on call roster as required.
- To provide a consultative service to other Units as required.

- To provide leadership and guidance to Registrars/Residents.
- To demonstrate a commitment to working as a team member with peer medical, resident, nursing and other staff.
- To provide efficient, safe and quality care across the continuum.
- To participate in the auditing and review of clinical practices to improve clinical outcomes.
- To attend Unit meetings and X-ray/pathology conferences
- To attend Upper GI MDT to facilitate and discuss cases that require input of Gastroenterology/Upper GI/Oncology and Radiation Oncology services. An example of contribution would be to highlight the availability of RFA for management of Barrett's cases that otherwise would not be referred.

Teaching and training:

- Participation in both Under Graduate and Post Graduate teaching and nursing teaching if required.
- To develop clinical skills in gastrointestinal endoscopy and the management of the complete range of gastrointestinal conditions and to develop research and teaching skills in the field of gastrointestinal endoscopy.

Research:

- Co-ordinate current clinical Endoscopy research where Austin Health is the lead site.
- Co-ordinate research for which Austin Health is a participating site
- Involvement in the applicants own studies as per discussions with supervising interventional consultants at the commencement of their employment term. This would involve:
 - Project design and ethics submission
 - Patient recruitment
 - Preparation of manuscripts for peer reviewed publications
- Depending on the success of the candidate a formal higher degree e.g. MD or PhD would be considered.
- Evaluation and introduction of new endoscopy equipment at Austin Health

Other:

- To assist the Director of Endoscopy in administrative duties as required.
- To assist in making a safe working environment by reporting any incidents of unsafe work practices, sites or equipment.
- To assist in the resolution of identified issues as required.
- To participate in the Austin Health performance appraisal program as required.
- To undertake not to reveal to any person or entity any confidential information relating to patients and employees, policies, processes and dealings and not to make public statements relating to the affairs of Austin Health without prior authority of the Chief Executive Officer
- To participate in the emergency incident response activities, as defined within the Emergency Response Manual, as and when require, at the direction of management

- Demonstrated commitment to high quality patient care
- Demonstrated teamwork and collaboration
- Demonstrated ability to communicate at all levels

Desirable but not essential:

- A sound understanding of information technology including clinical systems, applications relevant to the Management of rostering and risk management reporting or as required for the role and/or department.
