Position Purpose

The Cardiology Department is responsible for the provision of an extensive range of cardiac services to inpatients and outpatients including general cardiology, heart failure, echocardiography, cardiac catheterisation and interventional procedures and non-invasive diagnostic procedures.

About the Department

The Cardiology Department provides clinical services to inpatients and outpatients, teaching of undergraduates and postgraduates and is involved in clinical and basic cardiovascular research.

- Senior medical staff consists of 27 consultants, 4 registrars, 6 fellows (EP, Echo, Interventional, Structural, Pulmonary Hypertension and Heart Failure) and 3 junior medical staff.
- The unit has clinical interests in all of the major subspecialties of cardiology: interventional and structural cardiology, clinical and invasive electrophysiology (device implantation, ablation for arrhythmia), heart failure (optimising cardiac function through pharmacologic and device therapy, exercise and outpatient support), valvular heart disease and non-invasive cardiac imaging (transthoracic, transoesophageal and stress echocardiography).

- Participate in the auditing and review of clinical practices to improve clinical outcomes as part of Clinical Governance Systems within the Heart Failure Service.at Austin Health.
